# The quarter finals will take place today

Yesterday's eight finals at Argüelles and TEC shaped today's matches

## A memorable game: Vern vs Azerbaijan

This match has been said to be one of the most interesting matches so far by the referees. Both teams seemed to be in a balance of strategy, coordination and force.

Not until the second half of the match could be observed which of the teams would be victorious since the scoreboard kept fluctuating in favour of each of the teams. It was in a tie (4-4) when one of the teams finally took off. The Croatians started to dominate the pitch and they scored goal after goal right into Azerbaijan's nose. In the last minute of the match, Azerbaijan's goalkeeper was hit by a ball straight to the face. He had to be medically assisted. The final result was eight to four for Vern. An outstanding match.

The eight finals have been as exciting as expected. From the 22 teams that have been playing since Monday, six of them did not pass the group phase. The teams that will compete for the last positions in the ranking are Tromso, Münster, Geneva, Neuchatel, Marmara and Orebro.

As for yesterday's matches, the Irish and British teams could not avoid losing the game against their rivals. Cork's goalkeeper held several goals from

Valladolid team, but the Spanish could score more than they stopped. 16 to 2 for the Spanish. Similarly, York lost their match against the Parisiens in the same fashion (12-1) and in the same line Istanbul beat the Estonian without leaving a chance for the Baltic team. The confrontation between Ukraine and Poland (8-2) was not any less interesting. Although the Polish fans did not fail in cheering their team, Ukraine scored goal after goal, and the Polish team faltered seeing that their victory was further

and further away. In the first half of the match that confronted Russia and Israel (8-2), the former was able to set the scores for the victory and they maintained their score higher than their opponents in spite of Israel's attempts to reach their goal. As for Minho - Jyvaskyla, the Portuguese team continue to be as unbeatable (4-3) as ever.

Finally, the local team (Malaga) was victorious against their Norwegian rivals, although they fail ed several shots at their goal.

## Malaga loses its chance to qualify

The local team of Malaga lost against the University of Tampere. On the first half, the Spanish team was on the move and kept the Finnish under the ropes. However, they were not able to score and that turned out to be their downfall. On the second half, Malaga slowed down and the Tampere girls took this chance to score 3 to 0 against them and take the win. After the game, Jussi-Pekka, the Tampere coach mentioned that "on the first half Malaga gave us a lot of trouble, because they were really good on defense and counterattacking" and congratulated them for a job well done. He also congratulated the Tampere fans, and thanked them for their support and the great atmosphere at El Maulí.

Yesterday, the fourth day of the championship took place. It was marked by the tragic train wreck in Santiago, and a minute of silence was observed at the beginning of each game.

The match between the universities of Zurich (SUI) and Minho (POR) did not disappoint the fans gathered at El Maulí. Minho started the game by

being continuously on the attack, but the Swiss team did a great job and managed to hold up for most of the first half. However, the Portuguese players prevailed in the end and breached the Swiss defense by four goals to none at the break. On the second half, Minho did not slow down and the match ended in a win for the Portuguese team, nine goals to two. The portuguese trainer, Anselmo Calais, declared that his team "still needs to improve their offensive skills and their perfor-

mance", but nevertheless complimented them on a job well done. At 2 o'clock, Rouen (FRA) and Sligo (IRL) played a very interesting match in which the effectiveness displayed by both teams prompted a tie at the end (6-6) and the consequent penalty round, which the French team won by a narrow margin, awarding them with the win.

Next came the Dnipropetrovsk (UKR) - Norwe-

gian UST (NOR) match. The Ukrainian team played a great game which resulted in an overwhelming win, eleven goals to one. The Norwegian could only hold their goal for five minutes, but after that the Ukrainian attacks kept coming. According to Sasha, the interpreter of the Ukrainian team and their representative, "our girls played strong because of training and more importantly, the soul of the team itself which is quite strong".

The girls from the Siberian Fed. University (RUS) won against the University of Szczecin (POL) in a match that at first featured two evenly matched teams. It wasn't until fifteen minutes passed that the Russians managed to get past the Polish goalkeeper. The Polish, who had played an excellent
